Elective Choices

Exam Preparation Programmes

General English + IELTS 20 hours per week (Morning + Early Afternoon)

Irish Culture and Society

This elective is designed to promote discussion and debate. You will focus on Irish history, culture and society. You will be encouraged to compare your own culture and traditions with those of Ireland and in doing so you will internalise, activate and take ownership of more complex language structures.

This leads to overall improvement in fluency and confidence in language use.

The Language of Journalism

This elective is designed to develop English language use in journalistic contexts.

You will focus on developing key journalistic competencies across the four core language skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing. This development will be set in the context of current social, economic and political issues in Ireland, Europe and beyond.



Exam Preparation (IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge)

This elective is designed to develop effective exam strategies and testing skills in the context of core language skills development. The learner will prepare for externally accredited examinations such as IELTS, TOEFL and the Cambridge suite of examinations. The learner will develop the core skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing as well as a clear understanding of the rubric of the chosen examination. They will also focus on the different task types and questions that may be presented, employing effective task completion and timekeeping strategies to give the best chance of exam success.

Business English

This elective is designed to develop language use in business contexts.

You will focus on gaining a wide-ranging overview of the business world. You will also acquire key communication skills that are necessary for professional situations and further studies within the field.

English for Academic Purposes

This elective is designed for learners who wish to progress on to academic programmes. You will focus on the development of language skills in academic contexts including developing an awareness of academic style in both written and spoken discourse. You will focus on the organisation and structure of academic texts and presentations as well as developing skills for effective participation in seminars and lectures.

The Language of Law

This elective is designed for learners who work or study in the legal sector and wish to develop a command and control of legal language for the purposes of working or studying in English speaking contexts. Learners will focus on the language associated with reporting on law, legal terminology, and argumentation or case trials. All core language skills are covered with a special emphasis on writing style and structure in legal contexts.

* All electives are subject to a minimum number of 7 students enrolling on the programme



IELTS

The International English Language Testing System, is a testing system designed to assess the language ability of candidates who need to work or study where English is the language of communication.

IELTS is one of the most commonly used assessments for English language proficiency. It is recognised by universities, employers, professional bodies, immigration authorities and other government agencies across the world.

In Griffith Institute of Language, we offer two different IELTS preparation programmes.

For learners who wish to improve General English skills as well as IELTS exam techniques, we offer 15 hours of General English + 5 hours of IELTS preparation per week. This course will get you ready to take on the full IELTS preparation course*.

Griffith Halls of Residence

Griffith Halls of Residence is a development of student accommodation built in two blocks. It comprises 165 apartments that provide accommodation for over 600 students. The majority of the apartments contain two shared bedrooms and a shared living space. There are also a number of single rooms available in shared apartments. Each two-bedroom apartment has two bathrooms, one of which is en-suite. There is 24-hour security, free internet access and laundry facilities. Self-catering and full board options are also available.

Host Family Accommodation

Arriving in a new country can be a daunting experience, but getting a true Irish welcome from one of our host families will make you feel like you are in a home from home. It is also great way to improve your English and learn about Irish culture and life.

Our Recruitment and Inspection Policies

At Griffith we have a policy of recruiting families, in safe and secure areas, with high quality houses. We inspect all of our families against a set of national standards, as well as some additional standards that we have added ourselves. In the interests of safety and in line with our accreditation standards, all of our families are vetted by An Garda Síochána the Irish police service.

It is a really good thing to live in a host family. My Irish mother is very kind and it is good to practise English with her. She always serves good food, and you do not feel alone in a new country. Her husband is friendly and their child is always talking with me in a really polite way. I can always ask them for help if I need it. Where are you located?

Griffith College Dublin is located on the South Circular Road; it is about a 20-minute walk to Dublin city centre and 10 minutes to the Luas, Dublin's tram service. There is also a regular bus service to and from the city centre.

Griffith College Cork is located on Wellington Road, just moments away from the main shopping and cultural districts of Cork City.

Griffith College Limerick is centrally located in Limerick city on O'Connell Avenue.

How do I get there from the airport?

You can take a taxi, which will cost you about €40 - €50. There is the bus number 16A which brings you very close to the College and there are public buses to the city centre from where you can take a taxi. We also offer a transfer service for €80, where the College Driver will collect you from the terminal building and bring you to your destination.

What happens on my first day?

Every English language student completes an English language placement test, which determines your level and allows us to place you in the most appropriate class. We then give an induction as well as a campus tour to ensure that you have all of the information that you need. You will begin your lessons on your second day with us.

How many class levels do you have?

We can guarantee 5 levels, Elementary, Pre-Intermediate, Intermediate, Upper Intermediate and Advanced.

Who will be in my class?

You will have a variety of nationalities in your class, from Europe, Asia, South America and the Middle East. The ages will vary from 16 to 34 and there will be a mix of male and female learners.

Is there a registration fee?

- 1 -11 week learners are required to pay a registration fee
- 12 24 week learners are not required to pay a registration fee
- 25 week learners are not required to pay a registration fee

Do I pay extra for books?

Depending on the programme you choose you may have to pay extra for books.

- 1 -11 week learners do not pay a book fee but must return their book in the same condition received it in. They will be required to pay a €50 deposit on registration for their programme.
- 12 24 week learners pay a books and materials fee of €100 and keep all of the books they receive over the duration of their programme.
- 25 week learners do not pay a book fee and they keep the last book they receive. When a learner moves level they return the book they were using and receive a book appropriate to their new level. Upon completion of their programme they get to keep the book that they finish with. If learners wish to purchase the books of previous levels they may do so by paying the appropriate fee.


